Confidence Simon Says

To start the game, the grown-up is Simon, and kids are the players (followers). Describe an action using the words "I'm confident I can...." For example: I am confident I can touch my toes. I am confident I can jump on one foot. I am confident I can wiggle my fingers. Sometimes describe an action without including "I'm confident I can...." I can touch the top of my head. I can wave an arm in the air. The idea is for kids to REPEAT Simon's actions when you say, "I'm confident I can...." But they DON'T REPEAT Simon's actions when you only give the action without the magic words, "I'm confident I can...." such as, "I can touch my toes." Let your child try being Simon when they are ready.
