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Sound Engineer



DJs create mixes, remixes and tracks of music. They can work in front of live audiences or work online, on TV or on the radio.



Musician

Songwriters, also called composers or lyricists, create lyrics and melodies for songs. They write lyrics, create jingles and backing tracks. Some Songwriters may also perform and record their own songs.



Creative Arts Therapist

Choreographers create and plan routines for performance, usually to music. Create dance routines to entertain at live shows, events or for TV and films.

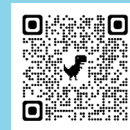


Marketing Manager

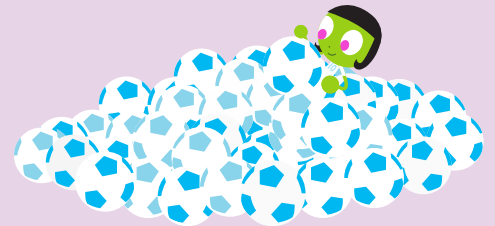


Sports Therapist

Armed Forces are a group of people that are given power to defend something (mostly a country). They are armed, so they are called the armed forces








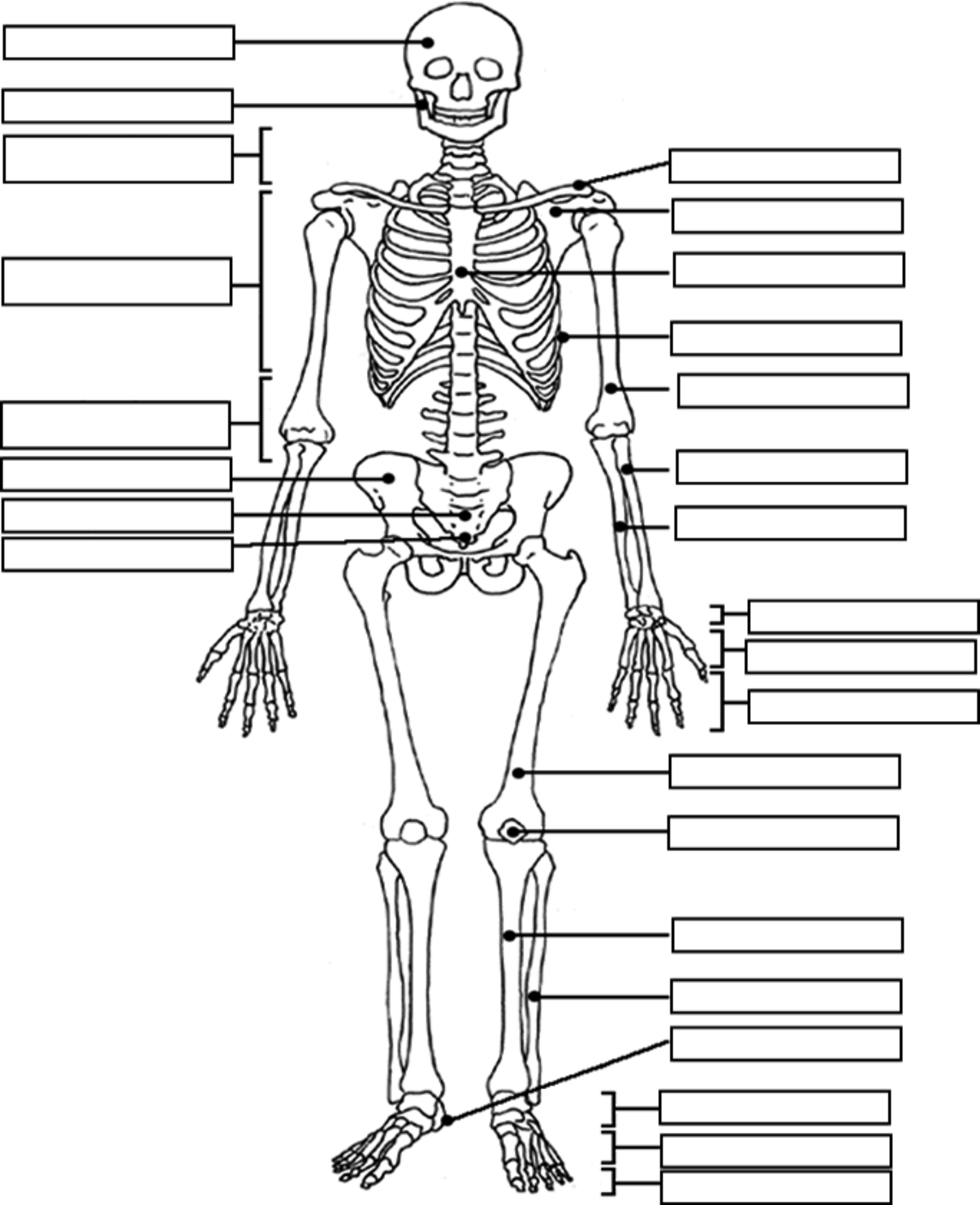
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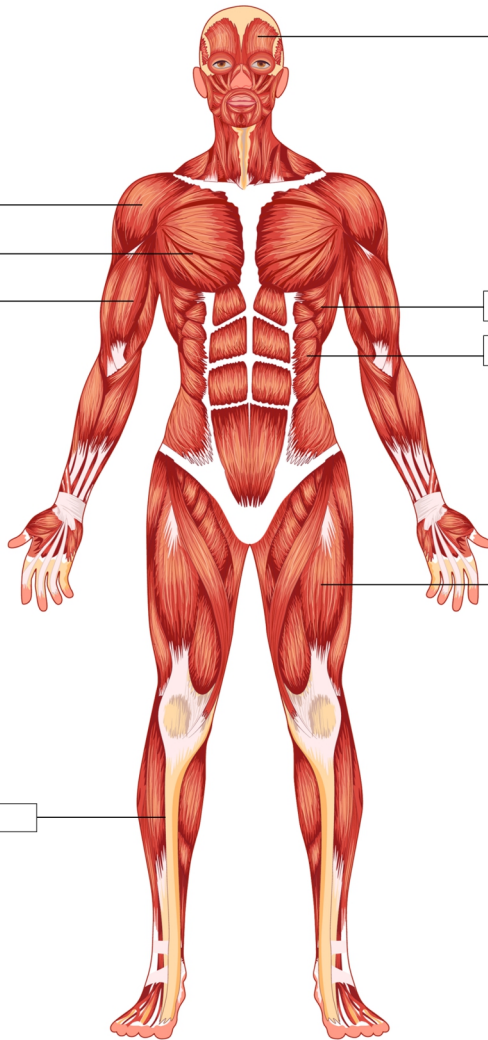
